This class will help you improve your time by perfecting your method. Anne will give you insights on

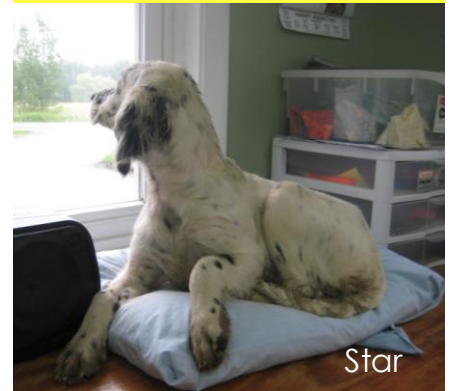
not only how to qualify, but how to receive placement ribbons.

We're Having a Holiday Photo Contest!

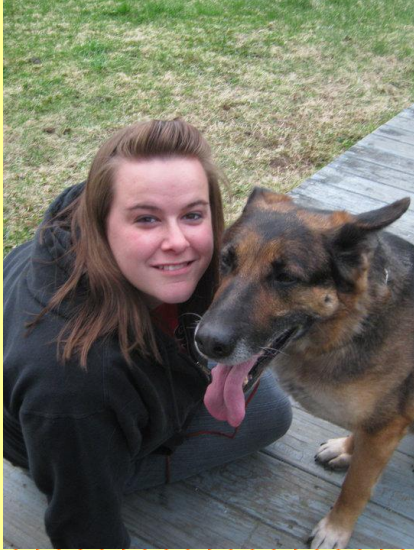

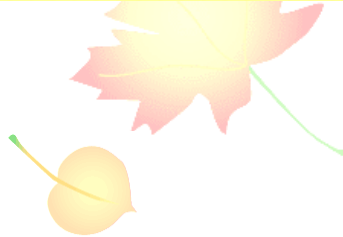
